1. Publication reference:

2. Procedure:

3. Programme:

Council Joint Action 2008/124/CFSP of 4.2.2008, on the European Union Rule of Law Mission in Kosovo (hereafter 'EULEX Kosovo') as amended by JA 2009/445/CFSP and Council Decision 2010/322/CFSP and Council Decision 2012/291/CFSP of 5.6.2012.

Contract specifications

6. **Description of the contract:**

a. The subject of the framework contract is to settle the terms governing the supply and delivery of medicaments, reagents and consumables by the contractor (see Annex II and III of the tender dossier for the relevant description of the items and the yearly estimated quantities of items that may be purchased during the duration of the framework contract) in 3 lots at EULEX Kosovo, Pristina, DAP (delivered at place — Incoterms 2010 International Chamber of Commerce — http://www.iccwbo.org/incoterms/id3040/index.html).

b. The framework contract shall be concluded for a period of 1 year with effect on the date on which it enters into force (although the framework contract may be terminated at short notice. See Article 36 of the special conditions of the draft contract).

c. The contracting authority may, at its own discretion, extend this framework contract. Such extension shall be made under negotiated procedure. The contract may only be extended once, such that the duration of extension does not exceed the duration of the initial framework contract. Any extension will be conditioned and limited by the Mission's mandate, the availability of corresponding budgetary funds and the satisfactory fulfilment of its obligations by the contractor.

d. The signature of the framework contract imposes no obligation on the contracting authority to purchase any of the quantities estimated in Annex II and III of the 'tender dossier'. Deliveries shall only take place following

the issuance by the contracting authority of 'purchase orders', specifying the list of items intended to be supplied with their respective quantities.

e. Deliveries shall take place within 30 calendar days after the receipt by the contractor of a 'purchase order'. f. In case of emergency situations (e.g. endemic infections, Mascal, etc.) duly justified by the contracting authority, the contractor must be able to deliver relevant items within all 3 lots within 72 hours after written request made by contracting authority

7. Number and titles of lots:

Lot 1: medicaments.

Lot 2: consumables.

Lot 3: laboratory consumables and reagents.

Terms of participation

8. Eligibility and rules of origin:

Participation in tendering is open to all legal persons participating either individually or in a grouping (consortium) of tenderers which are established in a Member State of the European Union, in an official candidate country, or a country that is a beneficiary of the Instrument for Pre-Accession Assistance, in a Member State of the European Economic Area, a country of the western Balkans region or a contributing third state, as authorised by Council Joint Action 2008/124/CFSP of 4.2.2008 on EULEX Kosovo as amended by JA 2009/445/CFSP and Council Decision 2010/322/CFSP, Council Decision 2012/291/CFSP of 5.6.2012. Participation is also open to international organisations. The participation of natural persons is directly governed by the specific instruments applicable to the programme under which the contract is financed. No rule of origin is applied.

9. Grounds for exclusion:

Tenderers must submit a signed declaration, included in the tender form for a supply contract, to the effect that they are not in any of the situations listed in point 2.3.3 of the 'Practical Guide to contract procedures for EU external actions'.

10. Number of tenders:

Tenderers may submit only 1 tender per lot. Tenders for parts of a lot will not be considered. Any tenderer may state in its tender that it would offer a discount in the event that its tender is accepted for more than 1 lot. Tenderers may not submit a tender for a variant solution in addition to their tender for the supplies required in the tender dossier.

11. Tender guarantee:

Tenderers must provide a tender guarantee of (see table below with the amount per lot), when submitting their tender. This guarantee will be released to unsuccessful tenderers once the tender procedure has been completed and to the successful tenderer(s) upon signature of the contract by all parties. This guarantee will be called upon if the tenderer does not fulfil all obligations stated in its tender.

Lot 1: medicaments; 1 000 EUR.

Lot 2: consumables; 950 EUR.

Lot 3: laboratory consumables and reagents; 950 EUR.

12. **Performance guarantee:**

The successful tenderer will be asked to provide a performance guarantee of 5 % of the amount of the contract at the signing of the contract. This guarantee must be provided together with the return of the countersigned contract no later than 30 days after the tenderer receives the contract signed by the contracting authority. If the selected tenderer fails to provide such a guarantee within this period, the contract will be void and a new contract may be drawn up and sent to the tenderer which has submitted the next cheapest compliant tender.

Information meeting and/or site visit: No information meeting/site visit is planned.

14. Tender validity:

Tenders must remain valid for a period of 90 days after the deadline for submission of tenders or until they have been notified of non-award.

15. **Period of implementation of tasks:**

The framework contract will enter into force on the date of its signature by both parties, but it will be only be implemented by means of 'purchase orders', i.e. deliveries shall only take place following the issuance by the contracting authority of 'purchase orders'. Deliveries shall take place within 30 calendar days after the receipt by the contractor of a 'purchase order' issued by the contracting authority.

Selection and award criteria

16. Selection criteria:

The following selection criteria will be applied to tenderers. In the case of tenders submitted by a consortium, these selection criteria will be applied to the consortium as a whole:

1) Economic and financial capacity of tenderer (based on i.a. item 3 of the tender form for a supply contract). In the case of the tenderer being a public body, equivalent information should be provided:

a) the average turnover of the tenderer for the last 2 years must exceed the financial proposal for the lot(s) tendered for (i.e. exceed the aggregated value of the financial proposals in case several lots are tendered for).

2) Professional capacity of tenderer (based on i.a. items 4 and 5 of the tender form for a supply contract):

a) has a licence for sale of pharmaceutical products issued by Kosovo Medicine Agency;

b) for lot 3 the tenderer shall have a manufacturer's authorisation form;

c) the tenderer has a minimum of 5 staff employed on permanent basis;

d) at least 20 % of all staff working for the tenderer this year in fields related to this contracts are permanent.

3) Technical capacity of tenderer (based on i.a. items 5 and 6 of the tender form for a supply contract):

a) the tenderer has worked successfully on at least 2 projects in field related to the subject of these lots in the past 3 years (2009, 2010 and 2011), the projects shall have a value equivalent to the amount of the financial proposal for each lot tendered.

An economic operator may, where appropriate and for a particular contract, rely on the capacities of other entities, regardless of the legal nature of the links which it has with them. Some examples of when it may not be considered appropriate by the contracting authority are when the tenderers rely in majority on the capacities of other entities or when they rely on key criteria. If the tenderer relies on other entities it must prove to the contracting authority that it will have at its disposal the resources necessary for performance of the contract, for example by producing an undertaking on the part of those entities to place those resources at its disposal. Such entities, for instance the parent company of the economic operator, must respect the same rules of eligibility and notably that of nationality, as the economic operator. Furthermore, the data for this third entity for the relevant selection criterion should be included in the tender in a separate document. Proof of the capacity will also have to be furnished when requested by the contracting authority.
