A longstanding partnership for the forensic search and identification of missing persons





Around 1,590 persons, who were reported missing during the period 1st January 1998 - 31st December 2000, as a consequence of the war in Kosovo during 1998-1999, are still missing. Their families have the right to know the truth.

The **Institute of Forensic Medicine (IFM)** is the only institution in Kosovo providing forensic services to help clarify the fate and whereabouts of the missing persons related to the Kosovo conflict, as well as the management of unidentified remains.

The **EULEX Forensic Medicine Team (FMT)** has been embedded in the IFM since the beginning of its mandate in 2008, working alongside local counterparts contributing to the general strengthening of forensic capacities and providing assistance, in particular, through **anthropology**, **archaeology** and **analytical capability**.





IFM and EULEX FMT, together with relevant authorities, such as the Kosovo Government Commission on Missing Persons and the Kosovo Police, and international partners, such as the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) and the International Commission on Missing Persons (ICMP), remain committed to the search and identification of missing persons.

TECHNICAL CHALLENGES OF THE SEARCH PROCESS

- Reduced reliable witness/informant sources
- Changes to the landscape and geographical features
- Limited corroboration between available information and aerial imagery
- Limited access to accurate records

TECHNICAL CHALLENGES OF THE IDENTIFICATION PROCESS

- Poor state of preservation of remains
- Inexistent or insufficient DNA reference samples from the families
- Individuals never reported missing
- Misidentifications





WHAT ABOUT THE UNIDENTIFIED REMAINS IN THE MORGUE?

Based on new research into potential cases of misidentifications and presumptive identifications, targeted collection of reference samples was carried out from families who had not provided before or which had insufficient reference samples. In some cases, additional samples from the remains in the morgue were also collected.
